At Lismore South Public School (LSPS) Preschool educators have sought advice and information from the <u>Australian Department of Health website</u> and use updated information from the NSW Department of Education response to COVID-19, on the <u>department's website</u> to guide decision making.

Preschool staff work with the Educational leader/School Principal, to ensure social distancing procedures are in place and adhered to in the preschool and school setting for the safety of all children and staff.

Covid safe school operations

Lismore South Public School Preschool - Ngulliboo Jarjums will enact safe working procedures in accordance with current Department of Education (DoE) guidelines for COVID-safe school operations. Where parents are unable to enter the school grounds, children will be collected by teachers at the front gate for arrival and departures. For early departures or late arrivals where parents are required to come on site, parents/carers will be directed to sanitise on arrival, sign in using the QR code and wear a mask.

Families are asked to sanitise their hands on entering the preschool grounds and children wash their hands in the bathroom on entering the preschool building or use foaming sanitiser. Children are regularly reminded to wash their hands throughout the day, in particular before and after using the bathroom, before and after playing in the sandpit and before and after eating.

Educators have taught children how to sneeze and cough into their elbow or into a tissue, this is then placed in the bin and hands are washed thoroughly. Educators have taught children how to wash their hands correctly and displayed visual prompts in the bathroom to remind children. The children sing 'happy birthday' twice while washing their hands to ensure they are washed for 20 seconds.

As per the DoE guidelines, early childhood staff are exempt from wearing face masks when they are working directly with children and when working outdoors. However, staff are recommended to wear masks or face coverings whenever indoors.

Educators communicate with children and will explain Coronavirus, in a sensitive way, in relation to what is happening and why, using children's books or videos. The Wiggles song, <u>Social</u> <u>distancing</u> is also used by educators to teach children about social distancing. Educators have explained to children what social distancing is and why we need to keep our distance from others. The video, '*Time to Come in Bear*', is about social distancing and has been shown to the children and discussed. Educators regularly discuss 'social distancing' with children and give reminders to practise safe habits.

During transition times when moving from one area to another, children refrain from lining up. Educators ensure that they allow more time for children to transition and ensure all children are supervised during this time. Educators maintain continuous communication between each other and remind children to keep their space and 'keep their hands to themselves' and discourage close physical contact.

Educators are regularly using the outdoors where children are less likely to be in close contact with each other. Children are allowed to play in the sandpit and are explicitly taught to wash their hands before entering the sandpit and when they exit the sandpit. The sandpit sand is cleaned and raked through with detergent on a weekly basis. Educators regularly remind children of safe hygiene practices at mealtimes and talk to the children about why it is not healthy or safe to share food. Children are asked to bring their own water bottles daily. Where a water bottle is not provided, a child will be given a cup to use which is put straight into the dishwasher after use.

Regular communication about social distancing is shared with families through Class Dojo and school newsletter. All families are regularly informed of any changes to these arrangements. Signs have been displayed for families showing correct handwashing techniques and 1.5 metres distance between adults. Educators 'check in' with families when they drop their child to preschool.

Signage is displayed for families indicating symptoms associated with COVID. Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any student with any COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.
